ALLEN Fanny

Born c1816 in Exeter, the wife of William Allen and the mother of James Allen I and Jessey Tree Allen.

Tobacco pipe maker, 3 Rowe's Court, East Stonehouse, living with her husband, William, tobacco pipe maker, and children (51C).

ALLEN James I

Born c1835 in St Peter's parish, Bristol, the son of William and Fanny Allen and the brother of Jessey Tree Allen.

Tobacco pipe maker, 3 Rowe's Court, East Stonehouse, living with his parents and siblings (51C).

ALLEN James II

Born c1825 in East Stonehouse.

Pipe maker, widower, Workhouse, Charles the Martyr parish, Plymouth (81C).

ALLEN Jessey Tree

Born c1837 in Exeter, the daughter of William and Fanny Allen and the sister of James Allen I.

Tobacco pipe maker, 3 Rowe's Court, East Stonehouse, living with her parents and siblings (51C).

ALLEN Mary

Born c1841 in East Stonehouse.

Pipe maker, widow, 2 Rowe's Court, Fore Street, East Stonehouse (71C).

ALLEN Robert G.

Born c1849 in Exeter, the son of Sarah Allen and the brother of Sarah Cates.

Pipe maker, 3 Rowe's Court, Fore Street, East Stonehouse, living with his wife, Christiana (21), born in Guernsey, Channel Islands (71C).

Pipe maker, widower, 5 Rowe's Court, East Stonehouse (81C).

ALLEN Sarah

Born c1816 in St Mary's parish, Exeter, the mother of Robert Allen and Sarah Cates.

Tobacco pipe maker, widow, living in a 'courtilage' of three houses between 4 & 5 Barrack Street, East Stonehouse, with her son, Robert (12), and her married daughter, Sarah Cates (23), tobacco pipe maker, both born in St Mary's parish, Exeter (61C).

ALLEN William

Born c1807 in St Peter's parish, Bristol, the husband of Fanny Allen and the father of James Allen I and Jessey Tree Allen.

c1835 He was living in *Bristol* when his son James Allen I was born (51C).

c1837 He was living in *Exeter* when his daughter Jessey Tree was born (51C).

1841 10 Oct. Pipe maker, living in *West Street, Exeter*, when his daughter Sophet Ann was baptised (St Mary Major, Exeter PR).

- 1842 14 Apr. Pipe maker, living in *Great George Street, St Philip and Jacob's parish, Bristol*, when his daughter Eliza was baptised (St Philip & Jacob, Bristol PR).
- 1847 18 Jan. Pipe maker, living in *North Street, Exeter*, when his son John was baptised (St Mary Major, Exeter PR).
- 1847 21 Mar. Pipe maker, living in *Rack Street, Exeter*, when his daughter Mary Ann was baptised (St Mary Major, Exeter PR).
- Tobacco pipe maker, 3 Rowe's Court, East Stonehouse, living with his wife, Fanny (35), tobacco pipe maker, born in Exeter, and children (51C).
- 1852 Rowe's Court, Fore Street (Brendon's Dir).

James, born c1835 in St Peter's parish, Bristol (51C), Jessey Tree, born c1837 in Exeter (51C), Sophet Ann, bapt 10 Oct 1841 (St Mary Major, Exeter PR), Eliza, bapt 14 Apr 1842 (St Philip & Jacob's parish, Bristol PR), John, bapt 18 Jan 1847 (St Mary Major, Exeter PR), Mary Ann, bapt 21 Mar 1847 (St Mary Major, Exeter PR), Robert, born c1851 in St Peter's parish, Bristol (51C)

ARTHUR Elizabeth

Born c1834 in East Stonehouse, the daughter of James Hodgetts.

- 1858 18 Oct. The daughter of James and Elizabeth Hodgetts, pipe makers of 52 James Street, Devonport, she married George Arthur, a cordwainer (St Mary's, Devonport PR).
- Pipe maker, 17 Quarry Street, East Stonehouse, living with her husband, George, a cordwainer (61C).
- Pipe maker, married, she was visiting 4 George Street, East Stonehouse (71C).

ASHWEEK John

- 1835 13 Jan. He was born in Charles the Martyr parish (Civil Service Evidence of Age PWDRO 14022 098).
- 1837 1 Jan. He was baptised the son of William, a tailor, and Elizabeth Ashweek, who were living in Bilbury Street, Plymouth (Charles the Martyr PR).
- 4 Morley Place, St Andrew's parish, Plymouth, living with his parents William, a tailor, and Elizabeth, and siblings (41C).
- Pipe maker, 26 Morley Place, St Andrew's parish, living with his parents (51C).
- Probably the *Bombardier Coast B.D.*, *R.A.*, *Antony Village*, *Cornwall*, living with his wife, Catherine (27), born in Mylor, Cornwall, and children Catherine (6) and Elizabeth (5), both born in Stoke, Devon, William (2), born in Plymouth and John (1 mth), born in Anthony (71C). However another entry in the census, apparently for the same man, listed him as 'unmarried' and living in military barracks in the parishes of Anthony, Rame and Maker, Cornwall (71C).

BALL Joseph

4 May. Possibly the Joseph, son of Joseph and Mary Ball, who was baptised in Plymouth (St Andrew's PR).

- 3-4 May. Lease and release, Dorothy Stephens to Joseph Ball, the younger, of Plymouth, pipe maker, of a house in Whimple Street, Plymouth (PWDRO 47/4a-b).
- Sep. Probably the 'Joseph Ball for high rent of Mr John Collier's dwelling house in Whimple Street, yearly rent £1.1s.1d' (PWDRO Borough Rental Books 1-200/1-201).
- 1740-52 Probably the Joseph Ball who appears in the list of free tenants of Plymouth Borough (PWDRO 1-2740).
- 30 Aug. Will of Joseph Ball of Plymouth, pipe maker, with attached administration. He left two tenements in Plymouth near the old conduit and a passage leading to Jacobs Well, a tenement in Nutt Street and messuages in Wimple Street in the occupation of Joseph Colin, goldsmith, and a messuage in St Andrew's Street, and also a silver tankard marked 'IB' (PWDRO 3335/1).
- 1748 22 Jan. Probably the Joseph Ball who was buried at St Andrew's, Plymouth (PR).

BARNARD Ann

Born c1814 in Devonport.

Pipe maker, widow, 10-11 Water Street, East Stonehouse (81C).

BASTAIN Peter

- 1811 1 Apr. A pipe maker and widower of St Andrew's parish, he married Sarah Miners of the same parish (Devon Heritage Trust DEX/7/b/1/1811/128).
- 7 Aug. He was probably the Peter Baston, pipe maker, who was living with his wife Sarah in *Great Ann Street, Bristol*, when his son Henry was baptised (St Philip's parish registers, Bristol).

BENNETT John

Born c1836 in Norfolk.

Pipe maker, lodging at Quarry Street Tenements, St Andrew's parish, Plymouth (61C).

BLATCHLEY Abraham

- 7 Jan. Probably the Abraham Blatchley, son of Isaac and Mary Blatchley, who was baptised in St Philip and Jacob's parish, Bristol (St Philip & Jacob PR).
- Pipe maker, *Preston Street, St Mary Major, Exeter*, (23) born in Bristol, living with his wife, Sarah (22), pipe maker, born in Exeter, Devon, and son, William (51C).
- He had moved to Plymouth as his son, Edward, was born in St Andrew's parish (61C).
- Pipe maker journeyman, 30 William Street, St Andrew's parish, living with his wife, Sarah (30), and children (61C).
- Pipe maker, *Coombe Street, St Mary Major, Exeter*, living with his wife, Sarah (39), and son, Edward (13) [Listed as Robert Blatchley, but this is presumably a mistake for Abraham as all other details would fit with Abraham] (71C).

1876 26 Apr. Pipe maker, widower, aged 49, living in Exeter, the son of Edward [probably a mistake for Isaac] Blatchley, pipe maker, he married Mary Crofts, widow, aged 47, the daughter of William Crofts (St Mary Major, Exeter PR).

BOOTH John James

Born c1814 in East Stonehouse, the husband of Mary Ann Booth.

Tobacco pipe maker, *Nelson Place, All Saints parish, Southampton, Hampshire*, living with his wife, Elizabeth (37), born in Plymouth, and children, Henry (8), Elizabeth (5), John (3) and Mary (2), all born in Southampton (51C).

1856 5 Sep. 'At the Truro Town Hall on Monday last, James Booth, pipe maker, *Pydar* Street [Truro, Cornwall] and a woman with whom he cohabits, named Mary Ann Baily, were charged with drunkenness and with cruelly ill-treating some young children of Booth's – the illegitimate offspring of his connection with another woman. It appears that Booth is a married man, and that wife is living; but he separated from her some years since, and subsequently lived with a woman, who died in the Plymouth Union House, and who bore him five children now living with him, of ages ranging from about 10 to 4 years. Booth and the woman Baily, his present mistress, earn good wages, and are addicted to habits of drunkenness, and also – the woman more particularly – to beating, flogging and otherwise illtreating the children. On several occasions, the neighbours, collected by the children's cries, and sympathizing with the poor little victims, have remonstrated with the woman, and have threatened to smash in the windows in order to get at the children for their protection, and also to send for the police. On Saturday last, on re-occurrence of such conduct, some of the neighbours went to the police station and gave information; and on the Inspector and P.C. Woolcock proceeding to Booth's house, they found him and his woman in a state of drunkenness; the man just leaving the house. The neighbours stated that he had then been beating one child, and the woman another. The man and woman were taken into custody, and locked up till Monday, when they were placed before the magistrates. Several of the neighbours gave evidence of their having cruelly beaten the children; and the children were examined by Dr Bullmore, who found marks of ill usage on their persons. The woman was sentenced to one month's imprisonment with hard labour, under the Aggravated Assaults Act; and the man, against whom the charge of ill treatment on the occasion in question appears not to have been satisfactorily sustained by the evidence, was fined 5s and costs for drunkenness; and both were cautioned and severely reprimanded by the Bench' (Royal Cornwall Gazette).

Tobacco pipe maker, 4 Richmond Street, St Andrew's parish, Plymouth, living with his wife, Mary Ann (44), tobacco pipe trimmer, born in East Stonehouse (61C).

25 Mar. An inquest was held into the death of a man named Booth, aged 67, a pipe maker working for Mr Cock, living in Magor's Buildings, *Pydar Street* [Truro]. The deceased was of a drinking habit and had drunk very freely during the past week and also on Sunday in his room. On Monday the deceased was found dead in bed. A verdict of 'death by visitation of God' was returned (Royal Cornwall Gazette).

BROOKLIN Catherine

Born c1813 in East Stonehouse.

Pipe maker, widow, lodging at 17 George Street, East Stonehouse (61C).

CALLARD (COLLARD, CELLARD) Mary

Born c1823 in East Stonehouse, the wife of William Callard.

- Tobacco pipe maker, widow, 59 George Street, East Stonehouse, living with her children, William (16), scholar, Mary (12) and George (9), all born in East Stonehouse (71C).
- 9 Jan. 'Mary Callard, a clay pipe maker, was indicted for stealing a coal scuttle, the property of John James Linton, at East Stonehouse. The prosecutor keeps a beer house at East Stonehouse, and on the 29th December last about five o'clock, the prisoner was in his house. Soon after she left the prosecutor missed a coal scuttle. Shortly after this the prisoner offered the coal scuttle for sale to a woman for 2s. Information was given to the police, and the prosecutor, in company with a police officer, went to the prisoner's house, where they found the coal scuttle. The jury found the prisoner guilty. Having pleaded guilty to a former conviction, the Chairman sentenced the prisoner to three months' hard labour' (Exeter and Plymouth Gazette).

- Pipe maker, widow, 12 Quarry Street, East Stonehouse, living with her son, George (28), no occupation, and grandchildren, Francis (12), and Florence (9), both born in East Stonehouse (91C).
- 1901 *No occupation*, widow, 12 Quarry Street, East Stonehouse, living with her son, George (39), general labourer, born in East Stonehouse (01C).
- 1903 Probably the Mary Callard who died in East Stonehouse (Ancestry website; parish registers destroyed).

CALLARD (KELLARD, CELLARD) William

Born c1818 in Morice Town, Stoke Damerel parish, the husband of Mary Callard.

- 28 Jan. Mary Ann Wakeham said that her mother 'works for Mr Callard, the pipe maker, she worked for him through the last year' (Western Courier).
- Pipe maker, 10 Brownlow Street (Brendon's Dir).

- 1852-53 Pipe maker, 10 Brownlow Street (Slater's Dir).
- 1857-66 Pipe maker, 10 Brownlow Street (Billing's & Kelly's Dir).
- 1861 10 Brownlow Street, East Stonehouse, (42) *no occupation given*, born in New Passage, Stoke Damerel, living with his wife, Mary (39), born Plymouth, and children (61C).

Pipe maker, widow, 4 Rowe's Court, East Stonehouse, living with her children, James (9), Elizabeth A. (4) and John J. (5 mths), all born in East Stonehouse (61C).

CARTER Rebecca

Born c1815 in East Stonehouse.

- No occupation, 3 Water Lane, East Stonehouse, the wife of Joseph Carter (79), a Greenwich Pensioner (71C).
- Pipe maker, widow, 9 Water Lane, East Stonehouse (81C).
- 1891 Almswoman, widow, 24 High Street, East Stonehouse (91C).

CAREY J.

In discussing the history of the porcelain works in Plymouth, Jewitt (1883, 212) followed the owners of the site using the Rate Books. At the end of their life as a porcelain works he recorded that 'in the following year [1782] the premises are stated to have been occupied by a pipe-maker named J. Carey'.

CATES Sarah

Born c1838 in St Mary's parish, Exeter, the married daughter of Sarah Allen and sister of Robert Allen.

CHAPMAN Ann E.S.

Born c1832 in Ottery St Mary, Devon.

Pipe maker, 8 Market Lane, East Stonehouse, living with her husband, Samuel (32), labourer, born in Guernsey, Channel Islands, and children, Charles (11), Anthony (7), Samuel (4) and Emealia (1), all born in East Stonehouse (61C).

CODNER Jane

Born c1824 in Plymouth.

- Clay pipe maker, 12 Willow Street, St Andrew's parish, living with her husband, Thomas (61C).
- Pipe maker, 11 Summerland Street, St Andrew's parish, living with her husband Thomas (71C).
- 1881 *Charwoman*, widow, 13 Summerland Street, St Andrew's parish, living with her foster son, John (16), born in Plymouth (81C).

COOMBES (COOMBS) Mary

Born c1840 in Limerick, Ireland, the wife of William John Coombes I.

COOMBES (COOMBS) William John I

Born c1836 in St Mary's parish, Truro, Cornwall, the husband of Mary Coombes and the father of William J. Coombes II.

Journeyman pipe maker, 7 George's Street (Back), Devonport, living with his wife, Caroline (41), and son, Matthew, born in Devonport (51C).

FURSE John

A pipe maker of Plymouth, he took Richard Stone as apprentice (Dorset Record Office, Corscombe parish PE/COR/OV 5/1/4).

GANDLE Elizabeth

Born c1841 in Truro, Cornwall.

GEE Mary

Born 1818 in Plymouth, the daughter of Andrew Wakeham I and the sister of Andrew Wakeham II.

9 Jan. She was baptised the daughter of Andrew and Betsy Wakeham (born 30 Aug 1818) (St Andrew's PR).

- Probably the John Rowe who died in East Stonehouse, aged 89 (Ancestry website; parish register destroyed).

- Tobacco pipe manufacturer, 9 Summerland Street (Thorne's Dir).
- 1878-79 9 Summerland Street (White's Dir).
- 1881 General dealer, 4 Summerland Street, St Andrew's parish, living with his wife and children (81C).
